# Precision Rifle

(Long Range Single Shot Rifle)

Long Range Single Shot Rifle (Precision Rifle) Side Match Competition will be fired Friday, April 8, 2011. Shooting will commence at 10:00 AM and continue as long as available light permits. In the event of a tie, a shoot-off will be used to determine the winner. The shoot-off will be on Saturday, April 9, 2011, after completion of the main match shooting.

All Long Range Single Shot Rifles and ammo must comply with the requirements listed in the current SASS Shooter's Handbook. Long range shooters are encouraged to familiarize themselves with the "*Basic Rules for the Long Range Competitions*" in the SASS Shooter's Handbook.

**Long Range Category:** The **Precision Rifle** match will be limited to Single Shot Rifle (any propellant) and Buffalo Single Shot Rifle (Black Powder, or Black Powder substitute Only), iron sights only.

**Ammunition:** Cast lead bullets only. Be kind to our targets, no jacketed bullets. Competition will consist of **12 shots** fired for score, not counting sighting shots or the shoot-off.

**Classes:** There will be a Men's and Ladies class for each category.

**Awards:** The winner in each class and category will be recognized by an Award Certificate.

### **Course of Fire:**

All Categories of **Precision Rifle** will engage 6 separate targets with 2 shots each at a distance of 200 yards. The targets will be progressively smaller targets, beginning with the largest target and ending on the smallest. All firing will be conducted from the shooting tables provided. Artificial support for the rifle is limited to the barrel only. The butt of the rifle may not be supported by any artificial means and may not be in contact with the shooting table.

### **Scoring**

Scoring will be by hits and misses.

### **Sighting and Firing for Score:**

All sighting shots will be fired at the designated sighting targets. Shooters will be allowed **2½ minutes** for sighting purposes. At the conclusion of the **2½ minutes** a cease fire will be called and all rifles emptied and made safe. This is similar to the system used in NRA BPCRS competitions where it works very well. When shooting for score shooters will be instructed when to load and the target designated. Shooter must engage the designated target. Any hit on an undesignated target will be scored a miss.

It is strongly recommended that shooters have their rifle sighted for the **200 yard** distance when they come to the firing line. By having the rifle sighted at 200 yards, the shooter can use the sighting time for final adjustment of the sights for conditions.

# Cowboy Lever Action Big Bore

Cowboy Lever Action Big Bore is a stand alone long range match fired at the long range facility. Rifles must comply with the descriptions in the “*Basic Rules for the Long Range Competitions*” in the Shooter’s Handbook. (Note: The smallest qualifying caliber is the 30-30 Lever Action.)

**Cowboy Lever Action Big Bore Category:** Cowboy Lever Action Big Bore is an open category, any sight, any propellant, fired from the Off-Hand position.

**Cowboy Lever Action Big Bore Class:** There will be a Men’s and Ladies Class.

**Awards:** The winner in each class will be recognized.

**Course of Fire:** Shooters will engage 1 target at a distance of 130 yards with 5 shots.

**Ammunition:** Only cast lead bullets will be allowed on the range. No jacketed bullets of any kind will be allowed. Ammunition required is 5 shots for score plus sighting shots.

**Scoring:** Scoring will be by hits and misses with ties broken by the time required to fire the 5 shots. **(This means the timer will be use on this match.)**

**Sighting and Firing for Score:** Each shooter will be allowed 3 shots for sighting purposes on the designated sighting target. All loading of the rifle will be conducted at the firing line. Shooter will be at the chosen position with the rifle at the ready, loaded with 5 rounds; hammer down on an empty chamber. The RO will ask, “Is the shooter ready?” When the shooter announces he/she is ready, the RO will announce “Stand by!”. The shooter will engage the designated target with 5 rounds at the sound of the buzzer.
